

# Fayette County Fall Family Walking Series

## Wednesday Walks



September 10, 2008— The series will begin with a “Walk with WHIM” in Masontown. Stroll through the residential section and see some historical buildings with your hosts, the WHIM (Wellness and Health in Masontown) committee members. Meet at the Masontown United Methodist Church at 6 p.m.

September 17, 2008 – Brownsville—“Rediscovering Historical Brownsville” Join your guide Norma Ryan on a walk through historical Brownsville. Meet at St. Peter’s Church at 6 pm.

September 24, 2008 – Christian Klay Winery—“ Sunset Vineyard Walk” Join Sharon Klay for a walk through some of the 10 acres of vineyards and see a tour of wine making ! Meet at the barn parking area at 6 pm.

October 1, 2008 – Jumonville—“Green Cathedral Walk” See the natural beauty of the Green Cathedral, experience Jumonville's architecture, and learn the historical significance of Jumonville from French & Indian War through the Civil War orphan's school and all the way to today. Robert Adamovich, an accomplished engineer/designer and local historian will be your guide. Wear good walking or hiking shoes and meet at the Beatty Museum, which is 2 buildings down from the main Jumonville entranceway at 6 pm.

October 8, 2008 – Ohiopyle State Park—“Tharp Knob Hike” Join park guide Clyde Trout at the Tharp Knob Picnic Area, which is adjacent to the Tharp Knob Overlook . It provides a panoramic view of the Youghiogheny River Gorge and the town of Ohiopyle. Enjoy the fall foliage on this great hike! Meet at the Tharp Knob picnic area at 6 pm.

October 15, 2008 – Dunbar—“Autumn History Walk” Walk through the town of Dunbar and along the newly constructed Sheepskin Trail. Hear about the history of the area from a local guide from the Dunbar Historical Society. Meet at the Historical Society at 6 pm.
